

## SPIRAL RIB PUTTER COVER



### Materials

- Yarn (MC) – 50 grams worsted weight wool yarn in main color. For purple sample, Plymouth Galway was used. For green sample, Plymouth Galway Colornep was used.
- Yarn (CC) – 25 grams yarn in same, contrasting or complementary color. For purple sample, Berroco Europa was used. For green sample, second strand of Plymouth Galway was used.
- Needles – U.S. size 7 (4.5 mm) – set of five double pointed needles, or size needed to obtain proper gauge.
- Safety pin
- Blunt darning needle
- Scissors



### Gauge

Not critical.

### Putter Cover

With one strand of the main color (MC), cast on 32 stitches. Distribute stitches so there are 8 on each of four needles, and join without twisting. Place a safety pin in the first stitch of the next row to designate the beginning of the round.

Add strand of CC or second strand of MC and continue with both strands held together:

Rib Row: \* Knit 2, purl 2; repeat from \* around.

Repeat Rib Row until piece measures approximately 4 inches from the beginning.

Row 1: Purl 1, \* Knit 2, purl 2; repeat from \* around, end with knit 2, purl 1.  
Move the safety pin to the first knit stitch of the round just completed.

Row 2: \* Knit 2, purl 2; repeat from \* around. As this round is worked, move the single purl stitch at the beginning of each double pointed needle onto the previous needle, so that the two purl stitches are kept together and the beginning of the round is always at the beginning of a needle.

Row 3-4: \* Knit 2, purl 2; repeat from \* around.

Repeat Rows 1-4 until piece measures approximately 9 inches from the cast on edge, ending with Row 4.

Next row: \* SSK, p2tog; repeat from \* around.

Next row: \* Knit 1, purl 1; repeat from \* around.

Last row: \* SSK; repeat from \* around (8 stitches remain).

Cut yarn, leaving an 8 inch tail. Using blunt darning needle, thread tail through remaining stitches, and pull tightly to close hole. Weave in ends.
